The Live Oaks Garden Club was pleased to present a check to the Brunswick Urban Redevelopment Agency as a contribution towards irrigation for the newly planted live oak trees in the Mary Ross Waterfront Park. Located on the East River in Historic Downtown Brunswick, the Mary Ross Waterfront Park features The Liberty Ship Memorial Plaza, where you can view a scale model of a Liberty Ship, similar to those built in Brunswick's shipyards during World War II. Other attractions include an outdoor musical playscape, staged pavilion and farmers market.

The Live Oaks Garden Club, a non-profit educational corporation, was established in 1997 to support beautification projects in Glynn County. The Club maintains the butterfly garden in Demere Park, provided funds for the new plantings at Jekyll Square in Brunswick, has contributed to the St. Simons Land Trust for ongoing conservation efforts, and has supported many other beautification projects over the years including the John Gilbert Nature Trail, the landscaping for the Frederica/Demere roundabout, and live oak trees along Demere Rd.

The Brunswick Urban Redevelopment Agency was established in 2013 as the primary development entity for master planning and developing priority projects in the Brunswick Urban Redevelopment Plan. These projects include the redevelopment of Mary Ross Waterfront Park.
